

## Admission Policy of the University

1. To decide policy matters on admission and to oversee the admission process, a 'University Admission Committee' shall be constituted. The Academic Council or the Chair of the Academic Council shall be the competent authority to constitute this committee. The Admission Committee may take appropriate steps for admission in various programmes.
2. To maintain national character in admission, an advertisement (in brief) will be published in the two national dailies by the University or by the coordinating University in case of a combined entrance test, with an instruction that those interested should visit the University website/link for the combined entrance test for further details. In case of joint entrance test, the University may separately issue advertisements in local/national dailies.
3. The UGC guidelines and Government of India directives regarding reservations in admission shall be followed.
4. To select good quality students to the Master Programme in different disciplines, the minimum eligibility shall be of 55% (50% for SC/ST candidates) of marks in the qualifying bachelor degree examination.
5. All applicants shall appear in written test. The University Admission Committee or the participating Vice-Chancellors in case of combined entrance test shall jointly decide the pattern and nature of the written test which may be followed by interview and/group discussion, if required for assessment of communication skills and general background. The marks obtained in interview/GD, if conducted, shall also be considered while computing final merit list.
6. The fee structure for different programmes shall be devised by the Academic Council. Changes in fee structure shall also be decided by the Council. Twenty percent of the total revenue from tuition fee shall be utilized to provide support to deserving non-stipendiary students on merit-cum-means basis.
7. Important Dates related to the admission will be announced by the University or by the coordinating University in case of the combined entrance test.
8. The University will have the right to cancel the application and admission of any candidate for wrongful submission of facts pertaining to qualifications, reservation and any other matters.
9. Any complaint or grievance regarding the admission may be made in writing to the University Admission Committee.
